**Wildlife CSI: The Fish and Wildlife Forensics Program**  
**With Hector Cruz-Lopez**

This in depth, day long workshop includes a general introduction to concepts unique to fish and wildlife forensics. Hector Cruz-Lopez, a Forensic Biologist with the Fish and Wildlife Forensics Research Laboratory, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, will provide an overview of crime scene and laboratory methods and procedures, as well as providing instruction on evidence management. We'll also spend a little time in the lab, learn how everything relates to the justice process and hear some case studies.

Because of the popularity of Hector's lectures and limited space (only 18 people per day) at the lab (Palm Beach county), we will be offering this class on two days, Friday, February 17, 2012 and Saturday, February 18, 2012.

He is recognized as an expert in court in the area of wildlife forensics, marine forensics, and underwater crime scene investigations.
